

**COUNTY OF ST. PAUL NO. 19**

**BY-LAW NO. 1384**

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A By-law of the County of St. Paul No. 19, in the Province of Alberta, to amend Bylaw No. 1318, being the County of St. Paul No. 19 Municipal Development Plan.

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**WHEREAS**, the Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000 (“the Act”) authorizes the Council to establish and amend a Municipal Development Plan;

**NOW THEREFORE**, the Council of the County of St. Paul No. 19, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

1. The Municipal Development Plan of the County of St. Paul, Bylaw No. 1318, is hereby amended as follows:

- a) The paragraph following Recommendation #10 in Section B.1 of Part 2 is modified by deleting the words “intensive livestock operations” and replacing them with the words “confined feeding operations”.
- b) Recommendation #11 in Section B.1 of Part 2 is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

Recommendation #11: (to be implemented immediately)

“The County shall encourage the Natural Resources Conservation Board to abide by the regulations approved pursuant to the Agricultural Operation Practices Act in dealing with confined feeding operations and manure storage facilities in the County.”

- c) Recommendation #12 in Section B.1 of Part 2 is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

Recommendation #12: (to be implemented immediately)

In addition to the minimum distance separation requirements provided through regulations adopted under the Agricultural Operation Practices Act, the County’s policy is that confined feeding operations requiring registration or approval and manure storage facilities requiring authorization under that Act shall not be allowed within the areas identified on the Map entitled “Areas from which Confined Feeding Operations are to be Restricted”, which generally includes all areas within 3.2 km (2 miles) of the Towns of St. Paul and Elk Point, within 1.6 km (1 mile) of the hamlets of Ashmont, Mallaig, Lindbergh, Heinsburg, Riverview and St. Edouard, within 1.6 km (1 mile) of Whitney Lakes Provincial Park, and within 1.6 km (1 mile) of the areas designated Country Residential District within the County’s Land Use Bylaw. Such areas shall be considered an urban fringe when calculating the regulations approved under the Agricultural Operation Practices Act.

Within these urban fringe areas, existing confined feeding operations may be allowed to grow up to 50% in terms of livestock units provided that they satisfy the regulations.

- d) The Section entitled “Land Use Bylaw Changes” in the Appendix following Part 3 is modified by deleting the first articulated action, beginning with the words “In cases where agriculture is already operating” and ending with the words “the change may be allowed”.
- e) The Section entitled “Land Use Bylaw Changes” in the Appendix following Part 3 is further modified by deleting from the fifth articulated action the words “intensive livestock operation” and replacing them with the words “confined feeding operations”.

- f) The Section entitled "Land Use Bylaw Changes" in the Appendix following Part 3 is further modified by deleting the sixth and seventh articulated actions, beginning with the words "Introduce regulations into the Land Use Bylaw" and ending with the words "pot bellied pigs, rabbits (as pets) etc."
- g) The Section entitled "First Parcel Out" in the appendix following Part 3 is modified by deleting from the second paragraph the words "intensive livestock operation" and replacing them with the words "confined feeding operations".
- h) The map identified as Schedule "A" of this Bylaw, identifying the "Areas from which Confined Feeding Operations are to be Restricted", is added to the Plan.

This Bylaw shall come into effect on the day of final passage.
