Rural Addressing

Our staff is putting in stakes for Alberta One Call so they can perform line locates before the permanent rural addressing posts and signs can be installed. Therefore we ask everyone for their cooperation so we can complete this process easily and safely. The location of these stakes have been carefully positioned within the County road allowance, so please do not move them! Moving these stakes will delay the completion of this rural addressing project.

The County of St. Paul No. 19 will be holding an information meeting to explain how the rural addressing system works.

Snow Flags

The County would like to remind all ratepayers that an Agreement must be signed and a snow flag must be purchased prior to the grader doing any snow removal on their property. You may pre-purchase as many flags as you like, they do not expire. Snow flags can be purchased at the County office, County Shop or Town of Elk Point office for a cost of \$20.00 per flag. If you do not have a snowplow flag posted at your driveway the grader will not stop.

Reeve at Large

At the April 14, 2009 Council Meeting, Council was informed that the second petition for Reeve at large was sufficient. A motion was made to file the petition as information and Council instructed administration to prepare a Reeve at Large Bylaw which will be given 1st reading at the May 12th, 2009 Council Meeting. A 60 day period is allowed for an opposing petition. If no counter petition is filed after 60 days, at the July 14th, 2009 Council Meeting, Council must give 2nd and 3rd reading to the Bylaw or schedule a date for a plebiscite within 90 days of this date.

Property Tax Monthly Payment Plan

Property Tax Monthly Payment Plan in which taxpayers make monthly payments for property taxes. Payments may ONLY be made by automatic withdrawal from a bank account. Each year after taxes are levied, the monthly payment will be adjusted based on the current year's taxes. You can sign up between January 1st to May 31st for the current year.
