- ! Add batteries to your recycling list! Each recycled one-use or rechargeable battery does make a difference to the environment.
- ! Batteries accepted are household batteries that are found in watches, cell phones, laptop computers, alarm clocks, digital cameras, mobility scooters, flashlights, car keyless entry remotes, cordless power tools and more!
- ! Each batteries must weigh less than 5 kg

Why you should recycle household batteries

Batteries contain toxic metals that can be harmful to the environment.



- By recycling batteries, you
- prevent batteries from ending up in a landfill.
 - keep people and property safe. Improper battery disposal could cause a battery to short circuit or overheat causing a fire.
 - reduce dependency on mining to produce the materials needed to make new batteries.

What type of batteries can be recycled?

Any household battery including Nickel Cadmium, Nickel Metal Hydride, Lithium Ion, Small Sealed Lead Acid, Alkaline and Lithium.

What happens to the collected batteries?

Call2Recycle collects them. Since 1997, Call2Recycle has recycled 500,000 kgs of batteries.

Does one little battery make a difference?

Yes. The County has been collecting batteries for recycling since 2017. Almost 4,000 lbs of batteries have been recycled!

How are recycled batteries used?

Processors at the recycling plant extract chemicals and metals to be used in the manufacture of new products.

The extracted materials are recycled into cutlery, golf clubs, pots and pans, stainless steel and new batteries, to name a few.



Batteries for recycling are accepted at all of the County Transfer Stations and at the St. Paul Transfer Station.

Automotive batteries are not accepted at the Transfer Stations. These batteries can be returned to the place of purchase for recycling.
