



! Not all materials are burnable at County Transfer Stations.

! Check with the Transfer Station Attendant *first* to find out whether burning is allowed. Burning is not allowed during a Fire Ban.

Why aren't all materials burnable?

Some materials can release pollutants, dense smoke, offensive odors, or toxic contaminants that can be harmful to human health and air, water and soil.

Is burning of prohibited materials permitted?

The County does not allow hazardous materials or the burning of prohibited materials at the Transfer Stations.

✗ Materials that are *not* burnable at the Transfer Stations

- Animal manure, animal carcasses/cadavers
- Combustible material in automobile bodies
- Containers that held pesticides or any other chemical
- Household Waste
- Oil
- Pathological waste (waste from human health centres)
- Plastic, including baler twine
- Plastic or rubber-coated materials including copper wire
- Rubber, including tires
- Waste material from construction sites
- Wood or wood products containing wood preservatives

✓ Materials that are burnable at the Transfer Stations

- Brush and fallen trees, solid waste from tree harvesting
- Wood or wood products that don't contain preservatives, such as paint
- Straw, stubble, grass, weeds, leaves and tree prunings
- Cardboard



To Burn or Recycle?

Many items may be recycled such as plastic, paper, cardboard and metal materials, used tires and beverage containers.

All County operated Transfer Stations now have 'Take it or Leave it' areas.
