



Let's Talk about Recycling Hearing Aids and Eyeglasses

! Recycled *eyeglasses* can help 1 in 10 people world-wide who need glasses.

! Recycled *hearing aids* can help an estimate 360 million people around the world who have hearing loss.



Lions Club International Hearing Aid Recycling Program (HARP) assists individuals who have moderate to profound hearing loss.

Hearing Aid Recycling

Adults and children can be affected which can impose heavy social and economic burdens on individuals and families.

What happens to the hearing aids?

Lions may -

- partner with participating hearing care professionals who refurbish the hearing aids to fit individuals,
- hearing aids are used during a health care mission to a developing nation, or
- a credit value is applied to the donated hearing aid by a manufacturer towards the purchase of a new hearing aid for persons who have limited ability to pay.



How to donate a used hearing aid

Carefully wrap and place the hearing aid in a Lions collection container.

All County Transfer Stations have depositories for the Lions Club Hearing Aid and Eye Glass Recycling programs



The Canadian Lions Eyeglass Recycling Program (CLERC) has been recycling glasses for over 90 years.

Since 1996, approximately 10 million pairs of eyeglasses have been collected - and have brought sight to someone else.

Are all eyeglasses accepted?

Yes. Eyeglasses in all conditions are accepted including single vision, children's, bifocal, progressive, reading, sunglasses, frames, loose lenses. **The Lions will take them all!**

What happens to the glasses?

They are sorted, cleaned, sanitized and repaired. The prescriptions are read and the glasses are ready for reuse.
