



! Left over paint can be recycled at the Transfer Stations as long as the paint is in its original container, the container is not bulging and the product is still identifiable.

! Since the Paint Recycling program began in Alberta in 2008, 26.9 million litres of waste paint has been recycled. That's enough to paint 403,903 homes!



Alberta's Paint Recycling Program is helping protect our environment by keeping paint and paint containers out of our landfills which can pose environmental and health risk if disposed of improperly.

What size of containers are accepted for recycling?

100 ml to 23 litre pails are accepted. This includes aerosols containers. Since 2008, 5.8 million spray paint cans have been recycled.

What happens to the paint and containers?

The material is taken to a recycling facility.

- Latex paint is recycled into usable paint,
- Oil based paint is most often recycled to be used as fuel blends to provide alternative fuel sources,
- Aerosol containers and paint cans are recycled as metals; or,
- Plastic pails are turned into new plastic products.



Is recycled paint available?

Yes! Calgary based ReNue Recycling makes a product called EcoCoat. It is a 100% Latex base paint that is available in 26 colors.



✗ What isn't accepted for recycling?

- Automotive paints (non-aerosol)
- Brushes, rags and rollers
- Corrosive products/ Industrial coatings
- High temperature coatings
- Impacted-immersion coatings
- Mastic coatings
- Nuclear coatings
- Quick dry coatings (primers, enamels)
- Rubber coatings
- Thermoplastic rubber or Liquid rubber sealant
- Tar-based and bituminous coatings
- Roof patch tars and greases
